LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Preparation of the Gifts and Table

1. The Bridegroom will be coming in the middle of the night and happy will those virgins be whose lamps are burning bright. But woe to those dull servants, whom the Master shall surprise with lamps untrimmed, unburning, and with slumber in their eyes.
2. Beware, my soul, be watchful, lest slumber bring you down and in the sleep of death you fall, to lose the golden crown. But stay awake, be sober, with a watchful eye and thus cry "Holy, holy, holy God, have mercy upon us."
3. That day, the day of fear, will come; my soul persist in toil, so light your lamp, and feed it well, and make it bright with oil; for no-one knows how soon may sound the cry at eventide "Behold the Bridegroom comes! Arise! Go out to meet the bride."
4. Beware, my soul; beware, beware lest deep in sleep you lie and like the Five, remain outside, and knock and vainly cry; but watch and keep your lamp undimmed and so with Christ put on the glorious wedding robe of light, the glory of the Son.
